

SETU Airsoft Society – Comprehensive Rules & Code of Conduct

1. Introduction

The SETU Airsoft Society is committed to ensuring that all members train and compete in a safe, fair, and respectful environment. These rules combine safety requirements, codes of conduct, and operational procedures to ensure the wellbeing of all participants and the reputation of the society and the college.

2. Core Principles

All training and play will follow three guiding principles:

- Speed – Move efficiently and decisively.
- Accuracy – Engage targets effectively and responsibly.
- Force of Action – Use superior tactics to overcome opposition.

3. General Code of Conduct

- Treat all members, instructors, and officials with respect.
- Bullying or harassment is strictly prohibited.
- Cheating (not calling hits, moving cover, firing through solid cover) is not tolerated.
- Members represent both the team and the college and must act accordingly at all times.
- No green lasers or strobe lights are permitted.
- Instructors' orders must be followed – their word is final.

4. Safety Rules

- Safety equipment (goggles/masks) must be worn until the hall is declared safe.
- If safety gear is removed, lay down your RIF and proceed to a designated safe zone.
- If goggles/mask fall off, cover your eyes, shout 'EMERGENCY', and all activity must stop.
- RIFs must not be transported loaded. Batteries may remain installed if clear and safe.

- Follow the four firearm safety rules: Always treat RIFs as loaded, never point at anything you don't intend to shoot, finger off trigger until firing, know your target and what is beyond.
- RIFs may only be loaded once safety gear is on and the hall is prepared.
- No entry into the hall without safety equipment – NO EXCEPTIONS.
- End of exercise procedure: remove magazine, fire three clearing shots, set to safe.

5. Equipment Use

- The equipment room is a safe zone – no loaded RIFs allowed.
- Equipment must be signed in and out; members are responsible for damages under their name.
- Do not hand equipment to others without proper sign-out.
- All members are expected to assist in hall setup and cleanup after sessions.

6. Training & Team Rules

- Attendance is required – all members must sign in at each session.
- Performance will be judged on teamwork, accuracy, and safe handling of RIFs.
- Fair play is essential – calling hits honestly and respecting rules is mandatory.
- Members must participate in setup, cleaning, and fundraising activities.

7. Disciplinary System

Minor offences:

1. 1st offence – 10 push-ups
 2. 2nd offence – 20 push-ups
 3. 3rd offence – 5 laps of the hall
 4. 4th offence – Permanent removal for the rest of the college year
- Cheating, bullying, or serious misconduct may result in immediate strikes or disciplinary hearings with the college.

8. Instructor Responsibilities

- Enforce all rules and ensure safety precautions are taken.

- Assign tasks such as setup and cleaning.
- Provide training on safe and effective equipment use.
- Resolve disputes fairly and answer member questions.
- Report serious infringements to college authorities.

9. Intersivity Team Selection

Selection will be based on:

- Attendance
- Performance (teamwork, accuracy, safe handling)
- Fair play and sportsmanship
- Participation in setup, cleaning, and fundraising
